



CONGO TO RECEIVE DEPORTED MIGRANTS FROM U.S.

Congo will begin receiving some migrants deported from the United States under the Trump Administration's third-country program, marking the latest African nation to participate in such arrangements.

The Congolese government described the program as temporary, at no cost to Congo, with the United States covering logistics, and said each case will undergo individual review in line with national laws and security requirements.

These agreements, which have drawn criticism from lawyers and activists due to human rights concerns and the potential return of migrants with U.S. protection orders, have already been made with at least seven other African countries.
